EXCELLENCE IN ACADEMICS

Each year at SCA, principals Emir Esparza and Kimberlee Gill lead the entire faculty in an in-depth curriculum review to assure that the curriculum we use best fulfills our mission. This year's review was on writing and it's implementation in all subject areas. I want to give you a brief snapshot of the incredible time and energy that are part of the review process.

All faculty members were assigned to one of seven subcommittees that did research for a good part of the year. The use of committees served to create vertical cohesiveness, encouraged collaboration and ownership, lightened the work load for all, and resulted in thorough research with better objectives. The following are the committees and the purposes they served.

The two Survey Committees distributed surveys to parents and teachers to solicit opinions and suggestions. A 51% response is required to verify accuracy and strong participation - your voice is extremely important!

The Standardized Test Committee reviewed how our students score in the area being researched and compared those test scores to the scores of national, state, and local students.

The State/National Standards Committee looked at how our curriculum standards compared to national and state standards. Differences were identified and considered for importance. Often, our standards are higher, which is indicative of the excellent program we offer. Another committee looked at other schools, both Christian and public, to research how they instruct and improve student writing skills.

The College Committee surveyed colleges and universities to see what they feel incoming freshmen should have mastered in order to succeed in their program.

The Textbook Committee did a thorough review of the various resources that are available. This committee delved into the areas of content, scope and sequence, and biblical integration.

The committees spent several months doing research and preparing written reports and recommendations. On an in-service day in April, the committees presented their reports to the faculty as a whole, after which the faculty agreed on the major recommendations to be presented to the administration. This year's recommendations were placed into three areas:

Teacher Training, which includes an in-service on forms of writing and how to grade uniformly, training on writing with purpose, incorporating visual tools into pre-writing activities, and increasing writing in every subject.

Supporting Students' Work through publication of works, contests, portfolios, and bound copies of works for visitors. The recommendation also included looking into the viability of a writing lab.

Administrative Research into the ACT writing test, electives that are composition focused, and support for teachers as they administer the time-consuming process of grading writing pieces.

There is excitement among the administration and faculty on the improvements to the writing curriculum. In a world that frequently writes in clipped, abbreviated, and non-sentences, developing excellent writing skills will greatly benefit your students as they progress through their high school, college, and post-graduate studies. You will begin to see recommendations implemented as early as next year! Please join me in thanking the SCA faculty for the amazing work they do in reviewing curriculum.

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BOARD REPORT

The SCA Board of Education met on Thursday, May 17. Rob Lytle gave a devotion encouraging the board to seek the Lord and wait for His direction. The meeting was opened in prayer.

Mrs. Harrelson reviewed the April financial reports, which show the school ending the year strong. It was pointed out that the board approved \$50,000 for improvements to the baseball field, so a line item will be created for that.

The ad campaign has tapered off. Most billboards are down and TV ads are no longer running. We will probably have a newspaper ad or two this summer and may do another mailing. We have many families touring **our facilities and considering SCA for their children’s educational needs.**

Mrs. Harrelson reviewed the most recent enrollment report, which shows a 3% increase over this time last year. She also shared a copy of the Memorized Bible Verses book that was published for students leaving 6th grade. The hard-cover, bound book has all the memory verses that students learn in their K-6 years (color-coded by grade level). **It is a wonderful reminder to our students of God’s Word that is hidden in their hearts.**

Mr. Esparza and Mrs. Gill presented an in-depth report to the board on the curriculum review that was conducted **by the faculty this year (see Mrs. Harrelson’s article on Page 1).**

Several new and revised policies were thoroughly reviewed by the board including Visitors to the SCA Campus, Custody Issues, Leave of Absence, and the Debt policy. These policies will be brought to the June board meeting for a second reading and approval. The fundraising policy is being revised and will be brought to the June meeting for a first reading.

The board suspended the general session and held the executive portion of the meeting, after which the general session was reconvened. John Hansen welcomed newly elected board member David Drum and recognized Rob Lytle who was elected for a third term on the board. John and the board thanked Terry Staley for his six years of service on the board.

The board voted to appoint Pastor Fel Bagunu to fill a two-year pastor position on the Board. The Board then voted in the officers for the 2011/12 school year - John Hansen, President; Rob Lytle, Vice President; and Mike Brown, Treasurer. The board voted to appoint Jim Pirie and Brian Merrell as board advisors again. Terry Staley was also voted on as a board advisor.

The summer board meetings will be June 16 and August 11.

VARSITY GOLF ADVANCES TO STATE

The SCA Varsity Golf Team won their district tournament, advancing to sectional tournament play on May 4. Team members Tim Cook, John Searle, and Henry Stratton made the All-District team and all qualified for state tournament play which was held on May 16 and 17 at Rivercut Golf Club in Springfield, Missouri. Out of all the Class 2 golfers in the state, Tim Cook was 24th, Henry Stratton was 33rd, and Jon Searle was 49th! Great job!



BASEBALL TEAM - 2ND IN STATE!

When the SCA Varsity Boys Baseball team set their sights on the state championship...they had a big dream! The team finished strong with 23 wins and only 8 losses. They became *District Champions* after beating rival Barstow 17-7! The Eagles then advanced to the Missouri State High School Activities Association State Sectional game May 23 winning 4-2 over West Platte, giving them *the first ever SCA MSHSAA Sectional win* and ranking the team one of eight in the state.

The team then headed into the State Quarterfinals on May 26 playing Stockton at Bolivar High School. They won with a score of 5-2, advancing them to the MSHSAA Final Four Class 2 in the State! They played in the semifinal game June 1 at Meador Park Stadium in Springfield, Missouri and they beat Clever with a score of 12-2, advancing them to the *State Championship game* on June 2!

The team started the championship game strong with two runs in the bottom of the first inning but New Bloomfield fought back and took over with a 3-2 lead. It was a tough game that ended with a 20-4 loss for the Eagles. **"We had some opportunities early that we could have scored more and that may have changed the pace of the game,"** Coach Gage said. **"Our pitchers tried their best and couldn't stop them. You gotta tip your hat to them.** Baseball is kind of that way sometimes. It humbles you and God put us in this situation to see how we would handle it." The Eagles were named **Second in the State**. We are proud of their perseverance!
